

Lively National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) Technical Tallahassee Chapter #72 Memorial Scholarship Application

The National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) Tallahassee Chapter #72 Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of Susan E. Hastings. "Susie" to all her family, friends and co-workers, had been involved in the construction industry for over 40 years. She started as a draftsperson, later becoming a residential designer and estimator. With time, she became a Certified Bonding Agent, dealing with the underwriting of Performance/Payment Bonds. Still later, she was hired as an Operations Assistant by a local construction management company – rising to the position of Project Coordinator before her untimely death in November of 2013. Susie's early years, competing in a "male dominated" field of construction, made her realize how unique her success in the industry was. Through her twenty-three year association with NAWIC, she endeavored to help other women advance in the construction field by providing opportunities for fellowship, networking, education, and mentoring. At the time of her death, she was serving as President of the Tallahassee NAWIC Chapter. Susie firmly believed in the value of a "technical school" education. In her honor, the Chapter has established this scholarship to carry on her wish to see others succeed in the construction industry.

This scholarship can only be applied to the following Lively Technical Center programs: **Air Conditioning, Refrigeration & Heating Technology, Applied Welding Technologies, Carpentry, and Electricity.** (This is subject to change with the addition of new eligible programs. Full-time enrollment is required.) Students interested in applying for the NAWIC scholarship must demonstrate financial need and should first apply for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Scholarships will be awarded on a semester basis and a new application must be submitted at that time to be eligible.

Applicants must:

- 1. Provide a statement of financial need in addition to completion of FAFSA online.
- 2. Submit a brief essay explaining the contribution you intend to make upon completion of your program of interest with the assistance of this scholarship. Additional paper may be attached for completed essay.
